#### WAIVERS FOR SY20-21

#### Nationwide Waiver to Allow Non-Congregate Feeding in NSLP, SBP, CACFP for SY20-21 - Extension

This waiver allows for the grab and go meal delivery models that many schools used this summer.

# Nationwide Waiver to Allow Meal Service Time Flexibility in NSLP, SBP, CACFP for SY20-21 - Extension

Regulation states that breakfast must be served at the beginning of the day and that lunch must be served between 10 and 2. This waiver allows agencies to send multiple meals at a time (breakfasts and lunches) and must be used with the non-congregate wavier.

# Nationwide Waiver to Allow Parents & Guardians to Pick up Meals for Children in NSLP, SBP, CACFP for SY20-21 - Extension

This wavier gives agencies the ability to allow parents/guardians to pick up meals without their children present. The agency must ensure htat hte person picking up the meal is the parent/guardian and that no duplicate meals are being served.

#### Nationwide Waiver to Allow Meal Pattern Flexibility in the NSLP, SBP, CACFP in SY20-21 - Extension

This wavier gives the CANS office the authority to waive the meal pattern requirements on a case by case basis when a school makes a request.

#### Nationwide Waiver to Allow Offer vs. Serve Flexibility for Senior High Schools in the NSLP for SY20-21

Offer vs. Serve is required for grades 9-12 during lunch. This waiver allows schools to operate a serve only program for high school aged students.

Each waiver is optional and the school/agency will go through the normal annual application process if they choose to use one or more of these flexibilities. Additionally, the CANS office is considering requesting additional extensions and waivers.




Schools Request Additional Support to Safely Serve Students During Pandemic

ARLINGTON, VA – The non-profit School Nutrition Association (SNA) is urging the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to allow schools to continue serving students through summer meals programs to address challenges of providing safe access to healthy school meals next school year. In a letter today raising serious concerns about serving students during the pandemic, SNA asked USDA to immediately extend all Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and Seamless Summer Option (SSO) COVID-19 waivers, including Area Eligibility, through the end of SY 2020/2021. The extensions would allow schools to serve all students school breakfast and lunch at no charge to best support social distancing measures, whether service is in the cafeteria, the classroom or at curbside pick-up.
